FRUITS OF HOLY COMMUNION

The unity of the Mystical Body. If you are the Body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. To that which you are you respond 'Amen' (yes, it is true) and by responding to it you assent to it. For you hear the words, 'the Body of Christ' and respond 'Amen'. Be then a member of the Body of Christ that your Amen may be true (CCC1396).

The Eucharist commits us to the poor. To receive in truth the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us, we must recognise Christ in the poorest, his brethren: As St John Chrysostom preaches: 'You have tasted the Blood of the Lord, yet you do not recognise your brother ... You dishonour this table when you do not judge worthy of sharing your food someone judged worthy to take part in this meal ... God freed you from all your sins and invited you here, but you have not become more merciful"(CCC1397).
